



2021 SUMMER DAY CAMPS AT THE GRANITE YMCA

Thank you for choosing to attend summer day camp at The Granite YMCA, we are so excited you will be joining us. The following communication will assist you with any questions you might have regarding summer day camp and COVID-19 health and safety guidelines.

As camp gets ready to open, we will notify campers and families any additional information by email and post on our website. These and other policies may change in accordance with the camp recommendations from the CDC, American Camp Association, and DHHS, our state licensing agency.

Frequently Asked Questions (Updated 6/15/21)

What are the drop off and pick up procedures?

There will be curbside drop off/pick up and only campers will get out of the car. Parent/guardian will sign their child in and/or out of care. You must present your ID at the time of pick up.

Will masks be required at camp?

If campers are participating in an **outdoor camp**, they will not be required to wear a mask unless:

- Riding a bus.
- Participating in rainy day programs that are held indoors.

If campers are participating in an **indoor camp**, they will be **required** to wear a mask when:

- Riding a bus.
- Working in small groups where they are not able to socially distance.
- Moving throughout a facility as a group.

What are the travel restrictions?

Regardless of vaccination status, campers will not be required to quarantine after traveling domestically, even if using public transportation. Campers will be required to quarantine for up to 10 days if they have traveled abroad.

What happens if my child is sick the day of camp?

If you or your child are not feeling well, particularly if you have an ongoing cough or fever, please stay home. Campers may not return to camp after falling ill without a doctor's note or a negative PCR test.

What if my child is exposed to a positive COVID-19 case?

If your child is exposed to a positive case, they will be required to quarantine for up to 10 days.

How frequently will the campers be sanitizing and washing their hands?

Children will sanitize their hands before entering camp. Hand sanitizing stations will be available throughout the camp. Campers will be washing their hands before and after eating, after using the restroom, transitioning to different locations, before and after using shared equipment, after sneezing, coughing and nose blowing.

What measures are you taking to prevent the spread of germs and viruses?

We will be cleaning and disinfecting communal spaces in between group uses and frequently touched surfaces throughout the day.

Will campers get to swim?

Campers will be able to swim daily if that is part of the day camp program.

Will there be social distancing?

There will be staggered lunch times with fewer campers who can sit further away from each other and tables will be cleaned between uses. There will be smaller groups where the same campers and staff will stay together all day and not mix with other groups.

PLEASE NOTE:

- All staff and children attending or working in a camp or summer program held in a partner school will be subject to SAU COVID-19 mask and health policies in addition to The Granite YMCA policies.
- We strongly support and encourage mask use for all.
- Y staff will be required to provide proof of vaccination to The Granite YMCA supervisors/HR.
- Non-Y partners will be asked to follow our staff masking policies.
- The Granite YMCA reserves the prerogative to reinstate any PPE policies at any time to ensure the safety of our members, staff and the community.
